Mayor and Town Commissioners:

The following list is actions taken at the Aug. 6, 2012 meeting/s:

- 1. Approved the Regular Town Commission minutes of July 9, 2012 with a couple of minor changes, the July 25, 2012 minutes with a couple of minor revisions and also reapproved the June 4, 2012 minutes with one minor revision**
- 2. Proclaimed Aug. 13-17, 2012 as Florida Water Professionals Week**
- 3. Consensus for the Town Manager to provide an outline for the assessment of the PBSO/Ocean Ridge Police Services**
- 4. Directed the Town Manager to prepare a cost analysis for modifications to the Town Hall/Police Complex and Garage to accommodate Boynton Beach's Fire Apparatus and Personnel**
- 5. Confirmed the hiring of new Police Officer Harry Fenwick effective 8/13/12**
- 6. Adopted Resolution No. 2012-07; Strongly Supporting the County's Continued Allocation of the \$12.50 Funds to the Municipalities Pursuant to County Resolution No. R-2002-0192, Which Serves to Enhance the County's Intergovernmental Communications Plan; and Strongly Supporting the County's Disbursement of the \$12.50 Funds to Cover Expenses for all Municipalities that have Radio Systems that are Functionally Interoperable with the County's Radio System Without Arbitrary Distinctions Being Made**
- 7. Authorized a Donation of \$1,200 to the Sand Sifters towards the purchase of grabbers and T-Shirts**
- 8. Directed Staff to have Clarke Mosquito Control present at the Sept. meeting to address concerns**
- 9. Approved a One (1) Year Landscaping Contract with Chris Wayne and Assoc. in the Amount of \$43,008 commencing Oct. 1, 2012**
- 10. Directed Town Attorney to draft an ordinance amending the Code of Ordinance relating to reducing finished floor elevations as it pertains to garages or basements if it complies with FEMA regulations**
- 11. Consensus for staff to forward a letter to PBSO and the County Parks and Recreation Dept. requesting that the Inlet County Park be closed from dusk to dawn until provisions are made for full PBSO coverage**
