





Would you like a free Crime Prevention Survey?

Often folks ask the police for information about what a citizen can do to make their home and family more secure. A Crime Prevention Survey of your property is one of the best ways to identify potential points of vulnerability. This is just another service provided by your Police Department.

If you are interested in having your home surveyed, please contact Lt. Hal Hutchins at 561-732-8331.

In the meantime, PLEASE remember to activate your alarm system whenever you leave your home; even for a short period of time. Also, install secure locking devices; especially if you have plate glass near the doors.

If you own a single-family home, when you leave for vacation, add your name to our Dark House list so that we are aware. Also, notify your neighbors and stop mail & newspaper deliveries. Leave your home with the look that it is "lived in" by setting lights on timers, etc.

If your alarm system is connected directly to the Police Department, post the free-standing sign to alert potential criminals to that fact. Remember, the first sign is free to active Town alarm account holders and a second sign can be purchased for \$15.00!

Finally, the need for citizens to report suspicious activity – when it is happening – is essential. Please continue to do so. Thank You!

"Snowbirds" flocking back:

October 1st marks the annual migration of our parttime residents from the North; so, motor vehicle, bicycle and pedestrian traffic will be on the rise. Please drive carefully!

This also means that criminals who wish to avoid the cold will also be heading this way to pursue their trade. We ask that you remain vigilant and report any & all suspicious activity – while it is happening. This provides your Police Department with the greatest opportunity to identify those involved and to potentially thwart a crime & make an apprehension. Remember: "If you see something, Say something!"

Bicyclist/Motorist/Pedestrian Education/Enforcement Initiative results:

During the period from 09/13/14 – 09/18/14 the Ocean Ridge Police Department joined with other local law enforcement agencies from Broward and Palm Beach County to conduct a traffic initiative along A1A. Additional initiatives will be conducted in the future.


Palm Beach County Fire/Rescue Celebrates 30-Years of Service

KNOW THE RULES[®]

Halloween Safety Tips

1. Instruct your older children to **TAKE FRIENDS** when "Trick or Treating."
2. Make sure a **TRUSTED ADULT**, an older child, or you accompany your younger children when "Trick or Treating." A trusted adult is a person parents/guardians have come to rely on and with whom they and their children feel comfortable. Discuss with your child who will accompany him or her and make sure you are both comfortable with the choice.
3. Accompany, or make sure a trusted adult accompanies, your younger children to the door of every home they approach. Become familiar with each home your child visits and the people who are providing Halloween treats to your children.
4. Teach your children to only enter homes with your prior permission and only approach homes that are well-lit both inside and outside.
5. Teach your children to **NEVER** approach a vehicle unless they are accompanied by you, even if it appears no one is inside the vehicle.
6. Make sure your children wear reflective clothing and carry a flashlight or glow stick when traveling during the evening hours.
7. Make sure your children are able to see and breathe properly and easily when using facial masks. All costumes and masks should be clearly marked as flame resistant.
8. Teach your children to always stay in well-lit areas, never take shortcuts, and never go into isolated areas.
9. Teach your children to stay alert for any suspicious incidents and report anything unusual to you and/or law enforcement.
10. Teach your children if anyone tries to grab them to draw attention to themselves and loudly yell "This person is trying to take me," or "This person is not my father/mother." Instruct your children to make every effort to escape by walking, running, or pulling away; yelling; kicking; attracting attention; and/or otherwise resisting.
11. Consider organizing or attending parties at home, in schools, or in community centers as a good alternative to "Trick or Treating."

On Thursday evening September 25, 2014, Officer Giardino received a report of a delayed theft from a resident of 6520 North Ocean Blvd.(2014-0159). During the course of the investigation Officer Giardino was advised that the suspect was a former boyfriend. With assistance of the victim, Officer Giardino was able to retrieve enough information on the suspect to include him in the report. In addition, Officer Giardino recognized, that due to the delay in reporting, time was of the essence if any recovery or arrest was to be made in this case.

Officer Giardino continued to work with the victim in this case over the next two days and eventually met with her on Saturday September 27, 2014, and received not only confirmation of the name and date of birth of the suspect, but photos of the items reported missing in this case. Officer Giardino then immediately forwarded the information he had received. Based upon this information, the stolen item was able to be located in the Palm Beach County Second Hand Dealer System. As this occurred on a Saturday evening, response to the dealer location was not possible until the next working day.

On Monday September 29, 2014, a meeting with the second hand dealer who was indicated as having taken the property into his possession was conducted. Due to the fact that Officer Giardino had been able to obtain a photo of the stolen items, the item was immediately identifiable as being the item reported by the victim as stolen. It was then discovered that the items were "out of pawn" and that any further delay in investigation would have resulted in the loss of this property for recovery.

It is only due to Officer Giardino's timely follow through with the victim that this case was resolved in a manner which led to the recovery of the stolen item and its return to the lawful owner.

The victim in this case requested that Officer Giardino be commended for his assistance.

It is because of Officer Giardino's actions and the compliments of the victim that I hereby Commend Officer Giardino for his dedication and actions in this case. His persistence with the victim and immediate notifications led to a successful recovery of the victim's property and the handling of the case to the satisfaction of the victim.


