## Turtle Season Begins March 1



**T**urtle season begins on March 1st and ends on October 31st. Throughout the season, Ocean Ridge Tidings will provide you with interesting and informative turtle updates from Palm Beach County Environmental Resources Management. In addition, there are flyers and small table top signs available at town hall for residents, condo and homeowner's associations to hand out. Supplies are limited.

Three sea turtle species (the endangered green and leatherback and the threatened loggerhead) nest in Palm Beach County. Artificial lighting may deter females from nesting and can prevent hatchlings from reaching the water. Beach furniture and other obstacles on the beach may block access to suitable nesting locations.

You can help sea turtles by following these tips:

- \* Turn off all non-essential beachfront lighting.
- \* Replace incandescent & fluorescent bulbs with red or amber LED bulbs.
- \* Reduce lighting visible from the beach by lowering shielding, recessing, and/or redirecting fixtures.
- \* Use draperies or blinds to reduce interior lighting.
- \* Be turtle friendly by removing chairs, toys, floats, and boats from the beach at night.
- \* Replace wooden cabanas with lighter alternatives.

## 5011 Building Decision

**T**he Commission has made a final decision on the disposition of the 5011 Building. Previously, the Commission decided to maintain the Town's desire to eliminate commercial businesses in Ocean Ridge. In doing so they rejected the owners request to continue the mixed use in the building thereby having only residential occupancy. The owner then brought up the concept of de-annexing the property and combining with Briny Breezes. The Commission felt this would not be of any benefit to the Town and declined to support the de-annexation. Therefore, the building will remain in Ocean Ridge and will convert to strictly residential occupancy.

## Town Construction Projects

**T**he Commission approved going out for bids on repairs to the Inlet Cay and Sabal Island bridges. These repairs were recommended in a Florida Department of Transportation report. They are minor maintenance type repairs. The FDOT report said the bridge were in good condition and there was no concern about the integrity of the bridges.

The Commission also approved some surveys and permitting to send the excess stormwater from the Villas of Ocean Ridge to the Town detention pond. Some preliminary work needs to be done before final approval of the project. Notice will be provided prior to any construction commencement.

## March's Regular Town Commission Meeting Action Summary

6. Directed the Town Manager to formally notify the owners of 5011 N Ocean Blvd. regarding the termination of the commercial use of the building
7. Authorized the Town Manager to forward the letter, citing the Town's concerns regarding the All Aboard Florida Train Program to Governor Scott, Mr. Winkle and Ms. Dobbs
8. Approved the Bid Advertisement Process for the Inlet Cay and Sabal Island Bridge Repairs (also seawall repairs to Inlet Cay)
9. Authorized an amount not to exceed \$7,995 to Engenuity Group for the surveying and permitting costs for the stormwater connection for the Villas of Ocean Ridge to the Town's system from budgeted monies in the Capital Projects Fund
10. Approved a Salary Adjustment for Interim Police Chief
11. Policy Decision for the Commission to provide written annual evaluations for the Town Manager by Oct. 1<sup>st</sup> of each year
12. Directed the Town Manager and Town Clerk to provide job descriptions/duties for the administrative staff for the April Meeting

## It's Turtle Season

Sea Turtle Nesting Season in Florida runs from March through October on the Atlantic coast. During the sea turtle season, please remember a few simple things to help protect Florida's sea turtles and their habitat:

- It is against the law to touch or disturb nesting sea turtles, hatchlings, or their nests.
- Avoid going to the beach at night. If you must be on the beach at night, limit your walking and do not use flashlights or flash photography. The light may cause the female to abort the nesting process, or other sea turtles nearby may be discouraged from nesting if there are lights on the beach.
- Turn off outside patio lights and shield indoor lights from shining directly onto the beach by closing the drapes at night. Lights disturb nesting sea turtles and hatchlings. **Please make sure your beachfront lights are in compliance with the law.**
- While enjoying the beautiful beaches during the day, avoid disturbing marked sea turtle nests, and please take your trash with when you leave the beach.
- If you see an injured or dead sea turtle, call the Ocean Ridge Police department at (561) 732-8331, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission 1-888-404-FWCC (3922), or dial \*FWC from your cell phone. Please be prepared to answer the following questions: What is the exact location of the animal? Is the turtle alive or dead? What is the approximate size of the turtle? Is the turtle marked with spray paint? (This indicates that the turtle has been documented.) What is the location of the closest access point to the turtle? (continued on next page)

## A NOTE FROM THE OFFICE OF THE CHIEF

As many of you are aware, our community experienced an armed robbery of two residents last month.

Though crime has been minimal, the nature of the crime committed during this period caused much concern within the community. I, along with the members of your Police Department, have been working diligently with other agencies, and you the residents, to maintain the safety and security of the Town. With the assistance of several residents and the cooperative investigation among many law enforcement agencies, we have identified and removed some very dangerous criminals from the street. As always, your reporting of suspicious activity and persons is appreciated. With your assistance we can continue to maintain a safe, secure, and beautiful community.

As always, I encourage you to call upon us whenever you see something you believe is suspicious. For those times when it is not an emergency please call the dispatch center at (561) 732-8331. If you have an emergency I encourage you to use 911. In addition, I am available along with the rest of your Police Department to answer questions which may arise.

Once again, Thanks you for concern and caring about our community and I thank you for allowing me to be a part of it.





Janet DeVries, president of the Boynton Beach Historical Society, will give a captivating lecture about the history of Boynton Beach and the Boynton Beach Hotel.




**January 8, 2015**

## Volunteer Opportunity

Your Anthrax Committee needs volunteers to distribute antibiotics on the remote chance that the Town of Ocean Ridge is exposed to an aerosolized airborne anthrax event. No special knowledge is required. All that is required is attendance at about two hours of meetings per year.

Aerosolized Airborne Anthrax is a bioterrorist weapon. Unfortunately, there have been several anthrax episodes in the United States, including one fatal attack in Palm Beach County in 2001. While death occurs in 50% to virtually all exposed individuals, the disease can be prevented by rapid administration of appropriate antibiotics. It is strongly recommended that everyone be provided and take these antibiotics for his/her protection against exposure.

The Town of Ocean Ridge has signed an Agreement with the Florida Department of Health in Palm Beach County who will provide the needed antibiotics at no cost, as part of a program under the auspices of the Center for Disease and Prevention. We will be a dispensing site for our community. Our own trained and credentialed resident-volunteers will perform the necessary dispensing duties. (In absence of this Agreement other will have to line up at large public dispersal centers.)

You are urgently requested to sign up as a volunteer to assist with this challenge. We plan to have a Training Update very soon and would like to get as many of our residents as possible to share in this important program.
