

Town Has New Police Chief

The Commission voted unanimously to promote our Interim Police Chief Hal Hutchins to our permanent Police Chief effective April 6, 2015. Hal has been with the Town for almost 10 years and understands the type of police coverage and service the Town desires and deserves. He is available to discuss your concerns as is the Town administration. We will be appointing a new Lieutenant, an Investigator, and a Community Police Officer. We will also be advertising for three Officers to fill existing vacancies. All of these changes will be accomplished within our present budget.



Upcoming Construction Projects

The Commission approved a contract for \$61,400 with Anzco, Inc. to complete some minor repairs on the Inlet Cay and Sabal Island Drive bridges (and adjacent seawalls). The project should be completed in about 90 days. The Commission also approved some repairs on valley gutters on Inlet Cay Drive for \$9,580.

Police Union Contract

The Commission approved a three year contract with the police union. It will take effect as soon as the Police Officers vote in agreement, which is expected within a week. We're glad to finally come to an agreement on this contract.

Updated Home Alarm System

The Commission authorized the purchase of a new home monitoring system for the dispatch area for approximately \$10,000. This will replace the existing system which, although working properly, has become outdated. The system accepts the alarms from the homes so that the dispatcher can send an officer to the necessary location. The overall system has been a great benefit to the residents as we don't have to wait for an alarm company to contact us to respond.

Leash Laws



For your animal's safety and the safety of your neighbors, please remember to secure your pets by a collar and leash when you are walking them off of your property, around the Town, and especially on Old Ocean Blvd where pedestrian traffic is very heavy. Unleashed pets violates Sec. 4 of the Palm Beach County Ordinance No. 98-22 that reads:

- 1) It shall be unlawful for any dog to be off the owner's property (which property is exclusive to the owner and does not include common areas) unless the dog is under the restraint or control of a person by means of a chain, leash or other is sufficiently near its handler to be under his direct control and is obedient to that handler's commands or is caged/crated.
- 2) It shall be unlawful for an owner to tie, chain, tether or confine by electronic/radio device a dog on the owner's property within five (5) feet of public property, public access, easements, common grounds or the property of another without the consent of the owner of such property.

Please bring required documents: 1) Current vehicle registration for each vehicle), 2) Proof of residency (ie. Phone bill, FPL bill, water bill—postmarked within two months or property deed or lease agreement –min 6mos).



Non-residents seeking a seasonal beach pass may purchase beginning May 1 at the Intracoastal Clubhouse only. This pass is good from May 1 to November 15. Fee is \$90. Please show proof of vehicle registration.

April's Regular Town Commission Meeting Action Summary

The following list is actions taken at the April 6, 2015 meeting:

1. Approved the Regular Town Commission Meeting Minutes held on March 2, 2015
2. Proclaimed April as "Child Abuse Prevention Month", "Water Conservation Month", and the week of April 12th-18th, 2015 as "National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week"
3. Announced the Municipal Election Results
4. Directed the Town Attorney to notify the appropriate agencies that the Town of Ocean Ridge will remain in the Inspector General Litigation
5. Directed the Town Attorney to file a motion with the court to enforce the Sivitilli Settlement Agreement and file for reimbursement of the associated costs
6. Re-appointed Bernd Schulte and Jeff Lee as Board of Adjustment regular members and Hans Kahlert as the alternate. Re-appointed Steve Coz and Kimberlee Marshall as alternate members to the P & Z Commission. One alternate position to the Board of Adjustment will be advertised on website. Authorized a Contract with Anzco, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$61,400 for the repairs to the Inlet Cay and Sabal Island Bridges (to include \$24,000 for seawall repairs adjacent to the bridges) and an additional \$2,500 to Bridge Design Assoc. for Engineering/ Inspection during construction to be funded from the Capital Projects Fund
8. Authorized an amount not to exceed \$9,580 to Anzco, Inc. for repairs to the valley gutters on Inlet Cay Drive to be funded from the Capital Projects Fund
9. Approved the latest PBA 3 year contract dated 3/19/15 pending PBA member approval
10. Approved hiring Hal Hutchins as the Police Chief effective immediately with a contract to be submitted at the May regular meeting and also approved the proposed organizational police department changes
11. Authorized the purchase of a new alarm monitoring system in an amount not to exceed \$10,000 from budgeted funds
12. The Town Manager and Town Clerk will provide job descriptions/duties for the administrative staff for the May Meeting
13. Appointed Geoff Pugh as Mayor through the next Municipal Election
14. Appointed Lynn Allison as Vice Mayor through the next Municipal Election



Janet DeVries, president of the Boynton Beach Historical Society, will give a captivating lecture about the history of Boynton Beach and the Boynton Beach Hotel.




January 8, 2015

Some of these cases are the result of paperwork (i.e. bank statements & checks, bills, credit cards & receipts, etc.) being improperly disposed of that falls into the hands of criminals.

Record-breaking Tourism Dollars Expected for 2015

As many of you know, tourism is one of Palm Beach County's leading industries, providing local residents with thousands of jobs. With record-breaking snowfall and frigid temperatures throughout the country, it's not surprising that tourism officials are reporting high occupancy rates at local hotels this year. Just last year, over 6.24 million tourists visited the county, spending \$7 billion and generating over \$35 million in bed taxes, which was a 12 percent increase from 2013. Officials are expecting even higher numbers in tourism revenue for 2015.

The bed tax, which is paid by the consumer, is currently 6 percent per dollar on hotel stays and other short term rentals. The revenue is primarily used for marketing and advertising initiatives by the Tourist Development Council (TDC). Just recently, the bed tax was recently

increased by one percent which will be used primarily for combating ongoing beach erosion problems.

Additionally, the TDC provides funding to numerous agencies such as Discover the Palm Beaches, Florida (formerly Palm Beach County Convention and Visitors' Bureau), the Film and Television Commission and the Cultural Council. Each of these private not-for-profit organizations is contracted by the county and plays a vital role in support of the county's tourism industry.

As the winter season in Palm Beach County draws to a close, and the number of part-time residents and tourists dwindle, we can't help but feel lucky to live in such a beautiful place all year around. Many of our amenities are made possible by the injection of visitors' dollars into our economy during "season."

Protecting Our Shoreline

Part of the allure for many tourists is the county's pristine shoreline. In addition to so many activities our coastline offers, Palm Beach County is considered a top destination for snorkelers and divers for its exquisite reefs. As the acting chairman of the Southeast Florida Coastal Ocean Task Force, I remain dedicated to protecting habitats along our coast with ongoing initiatives such as the artificial reef program. These man-made habitats provide food, shelter, protection and spawning areas for hundred of fish species and other marine and estuarine organisms. They also provide relief for the natural reefs, which have shown decline of many marine organisms over the years due to user pressure, hurricanes and coastal development.

Over the years, the county deployed over 45 vessels, 82,000 tons of concrete, and 130,000 tons of limestone boulders in near- and offshore waters to create artificial reefs, which mimic natural reef systems. TODAY IS MY LUCKY DAY!

Not only do I have a job I thoroughly enjoy, apparently I am about to become very wealthy!! (*Not really on the wealthy part*)

Just yesterday I received notification from three separate people, *who are unknown to me but very important government officials*, that I will be the beneficiary of great sums of money in the very near future. Obviously nothing is free, so I will have to pay some small fees to get access to the cash promised. Does anyone want to help? (*I hope not*)

In the effort of informing and reminding everyone that the internet is rampant with schemes and scams trying to liberate you from your money, I have copied three of the most recent letters sent to entice me to send money for payment that I know clearly does not exist.

Please be vigilant and cautious in your dealings with those trying to give you something for free or offer you a large reward with very little investment. It often turns out that you become the one providing large sums of money to those who promised it to you.

The below copied emails are obviously scams, and though they may appear legitimate, are in fact only a method of liberating you from your money, should you participate.

As to that first part, I do thoroughly enjoy my job, especially when it allows me to stop people from taking advantage of others. Thanks for being careful and vigilant.

This "Fund Clearance Certificate" is a valid document, and it is required in accordance with the U.S. Monetary Policy. Hence, the \$150 to obtain the "Fund Clearance Certificate" is the ONLY expense you will incur before the fund will be credited into your bank account.


TIPS: for Parents, Guardians and Community Members

- 1

Bolting & Wandering
 Nearly half of children with autism will wander or bolt, from safe environments. They may seek out small or enclosed spaces. They may wander toward places of special interest to them. Or they may try to escape overwhelming stimuli such as sights, sounds, surroundings or activities of others.


- 2

Alert the Community
 Alert the community about other potential interests and attractions your child may have, including roadways, highways, trains, heavy equipment, fire trucks, roadway signs, bright lights, traffic signals, and buses. Providing this information may help make the search and recovery more successful.


- 3


Water
 All bodies of water should be identified in the community so they will be searched first if he or she wanders. A child's perception of natural water sources may be different than a dislike or fear of baths or pools.


- 4

Keep Some Distance
 Children with autism may shrink away from touch, so maintain a safe distance, keeping the child in sight without restraining the child.


- 5

Responding
 Children with autism may be non-verbal, non-responsive to their name being called, and fearful of any close contact with people they do not know. They may bolt from something that makes them scared or uncomfortable and run towards something that attracts them, even if we perceive it is dangerous.


- 6

Talk to Law Enforcement
PARENTS: contact local law enforcement to determine if they administer any programs to help track your child in case of a wandering incident.
COMMUNITY MEMBERS: If you come across a child who appears lost, stay with the child and call local law enforcement immediately. Wait with the child until help arrives.

Volunteers Needed

Your Anthrax Committee needs volunteers to distribute antibiotics on the remote chance that the Town of Ocean Ridge is exposed to an aerosolized airborne anthrax event. No special knowledge is required. All that is required is attendance at about two hours of meetings per year.

Aerosolized Airborne Anthrax is a bioterrorist weapon. Unfortunately, there have been several anthrax episodes in the United States, including one fatal attack in Palm Beach County in 2001. While death occurs in 50% to virtually all exposed individuals, the disease can be prevented by rapid administration of appropriate antibiotics. It is strongly recommended that everyone be provided and take these antibiotics for his/her protection against exposure.

The Town of Ocean Ridge has signed an Agreement with the Florida Department of Health in Palm Beach County who will provide the needed antibiotics at no cost, as part of a program under the auspices of the Center for Disease and Prevention. We will be a dispensing site for our community. Our own trained and credentialed resident-volunteers will perform the necessary dispensing duties. (In absence of this Agreement other will have to line up at large public dispersal centers.)

You are urgently requested to sign up as a volunteer to assist with this challenge. We plan to have a Training Update very soon and would like to get as many of our residents as possible to share in this important program.


