Ocean Ridge Shore Protection Project

According to the Department of Environmental Resources Management (DERM) October 2012 project status report, the Ocean Ridge Shore Protection Project is projected to begin December 2013. A report of the hard-bottom survey and mapping has been completed and the environmental and biological assessments are near completion. The Limited Re-evaluation Report for the Corps is 75% complete and a request for a Section 408 approval has been submitted to the Corps. Marcia and her husband, retired Ocean Ridge Maintenance Department employee Fred Martin, will spend their leisure time camping.

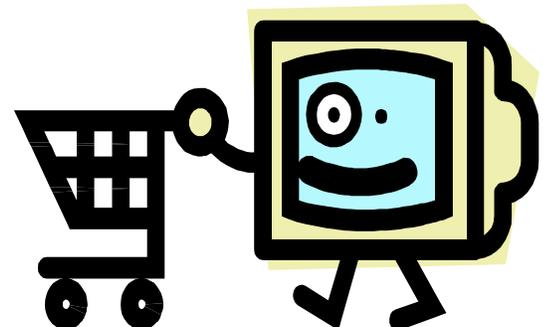

- * Check out the seller: If you're unfamiliar with the site, do independent research.
- * Read return policies: Date of purchase usually prevails, not the date of gift giving.
- * Know what you're getting: "Knock Offs" are counterfeit, that's why their cheap!
- * Don't fall for a false email or pop-up! Red Flag – Any Unsolicited message
- * Look for signs a site is safe: Is your info going to a secure site?
- * Secure your computer: Install anti-virus and anti-spy software and keep it updated.
- * Consider how you'll pay: Some credit cards extend warranty & delivery protection.
- * Know the full price and check out incentives: Don't forget, many sites are offering FREE Shipping & Handling this year!
- * Keep a paper trail: Print & Save your online transactions. Get a tracking number.
- * Turn your computer off when finished shopping; and whenever you're not using it.

Boynton Beach Holiday Parade:

On Saturday, December 1, 2012 at 5:00PM the annual Holiday Parade will take place along Federal Hwy. US 1 will be closed between Boynton Beach Blvd. to Woolbright Road from 2:30-6:00PM. Boat Parade:

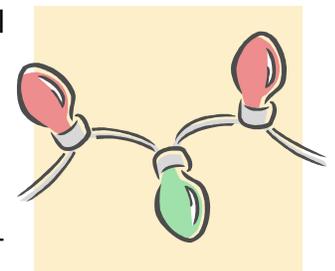
On Friday, December 7, 2012 at 6:30PM the annual Boat Parade will take place along the Intracoastal Waterway. The boats will travel southbound from the Boynton Boat ramp to Delray Beach. During the 60-90 minute event, both the Woolbright Rd and Ocean Ave. bridges will be up.

Boynton Beach Fire/Rescue Units will be staged in Ocean Ridge to provide immediate response if needed.

November's Regular Town Commission Meeting Action Summary

- 1. Approved the Regular Town Commission Meeting minutes of Oct. 1, 2012 and the Final Budget Hearing of Sept. 25, 2012 with a couple of minor revisions**
- 2. Approved Resolution No. 2012-15; Urging Local Retailers Selling Tobacco Products, to Refrain from Selling and Marketing Flavored Tobacco Products , Which Tend to Promote and Influence Underage and/or Youthful Consumption**
- 3. Approved Resolution No. 2012-16; Supporting PROTECT OUR BEACHES, INC., a Coalition to Finding a Permanent Ecologically Sound Solution to Protecting our Beaches and Dunes from Erosion**
- 4. Approved an Expenditure Not to Exceed \$23,000 from the Contingency Account to Repair the Damaged Crosswalks as a Result of Hurricane Sandy and also for the Town Manager to Obtain at Least Three Total Quotes**
- 5. Adopted Resolution No. 2012-14; Pertaining to Ocean Ridge Vacant Property Registration (related to Ordinance #600)**
- 6. Adopted Ordinance 600; Amending its Code of Ordinances, at Chapter Thirty by Creating a New Article IX Registration and Maintenance of Properties in Foreclosure on second reading**
- 7. Directed staff to obtain an FPL Assessment on damaged/obsolete power poles in Town and pursue removal of same**
- 8. Approved Budget Amendments for FY 2011/12 to include transferring \$21,000 from the Contingency Account and placing \$16,000 in the Inspection Professional Services Account and \$5,000 into the Physical Environment Other Contractual Services Account and Acknowledged that the \$4,700 overpaid in the Legal Special Counsel Account will be credited in FY 2012/13**
- 9. Consensus to conduct the Town Manager Performance Evaluation in January 2013**
- 10. Voted to Retain the Ocean Ridge Police Department and not contract with PBSO**

Recipe: Better Than Pumpkin Pie Cake

**Town Hall & ORPD
Tested and Approved!**

Ingredients

- 1 box yellow cake mix (reserve 1 cup)
- 1 stick butter or margarine, melted
- 4 eggs
- 1 can (29oz) pumpkin
- 1 can (5oz) evaporated milk
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1.5 tsp cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp nutmeg

Topping

- 1 cup yellow cake mix
- 1 stick butter or margarine, soft
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup mixed nuts, chopped

Directions

Preheat oven to 350F. Grease and flour a 9x13 inch baking pan.

In a mixing bowl using a spoon, mix the cake mix, butter or margarine, and 1 egg. Pour mixture into a pan and level across pan.

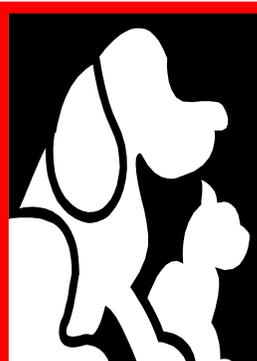
In another mixing bowl, mix the canned pumpkin, 3 eggs, evaporated milk, brown sugar, sugar, cinnamon, and nutmeg. Pour ingredients into pan and spread over first layer.

To make the topping, in a mixing bowl cut butter or margarine into the reserved yellow cake mix, add the sugar and mixed nuts. Sprinkle over second layer. Bake for 50-55 minutes. Cool for 30 minutes. Makes 1 9x13 pan or 12 servings.
