

Subject: 2011 Annual Police Department Report

Once again it is my pleasure to provide you with an Annual Report to outline the activity of your Police Department during 2011. The report not only includes highlights of the past year, but information regarding projects we are working on for 2012 & beyond.

2011:

Personnel:

- During the year, a Sergeant, an Officer and a Dispatcher/Clerk retired:

- In August 2011, Sgt. Dan Tinfina retired after providing more than 22 years of service to the citizens of Ocean Ridge and over 34 years as a Police Officer. His retirement luncheon was highlighted by comments and congratulations from two of his former Chiefs from Ohio, as well as retired ORPD Chief Edward Hillery, Jr.

- In September 2011, Officer Wavell "Doc" Darville retired following 20½ years of dedicated service to the people and pets of Ocean Ridge and Briny Breezes. When combined with his previous 27 years as a Palm Beach Firefighter/Paramedic, "Doc" has provided over 47 years of public service to the residents and visitors of Palm Beach County. Town residents Bob & Joelen Merkle hosted a terrific party at their home. In addition, "Doc" was given a great send off by a bevy of canines during a citizen-organized farewell event.

- In May 2011, having served 28 ½ years, Dispatcher/Clerk Jeanne Zuidema retired. Jeanne, an avid animal lover, was instrumental (along with "Doc") in creating the Department's "Pet Tag" program; which, in 2011 reached a milestone with the issuance of the 1,000th tag. Family and friends shared memories during a luncheon held in her honor.

- Following an extensive application and selection process, the vacancies resulting from these departures were filled by:

- Ofc. Larry Payne: On January 2, 1996 Larry began a career with the Riviera Beach Police Department. He rose to the rank of Lieutenant and has had many assignments throughout that agency; to include supervising the Detective Bureau. On Friday, September 30, 2011 Larry retired from RBPD as the Support Services Lieutenant. He started as an ORPD Officer on October 4, 2011.

- Ofc. Gary Roy: He began his law enforcement career in February 1990. In April 1992, Gary became a Police Officer with the City of Greenacres where he rose to the rank of Captain of Uniform Services. In July 2010 he left Greenacres PD and joined ORPD in November 2011.

- Retired Ofc. Gene Rosenberg returned to fill a void as a part-time Dispatcher/Clerk. Gene also serves as one of our Reserve Officers and the in-house police radio technician.

- Dispatcher/Clerk Michele Alfonso: She began as a Police Dispatcher with the City of Harvard, IL in January 2006. Michelle remained there until November 2010, when she relocated to Texas and became a Dispatcher for the City of Denison Police Department. In June 2011, she moved back to Florida and joined ORPD in October 2011.

- In addition to those newly hired, Ofc. Robert McAllister successfully participated in a promotional process that resulted in his appointment as probationary Sergeant on September 26, 2011. "Mac" has been with our agency since October 1, 2002; having served previously with the Manalapan Police Department.

- The above actions returned the Police Department to the fully staffed, full-time level of 14 sworn (8 Officers, 4 Sergeants, 1 Lieutenant and 1 Chief), 5 civilian Dispatch/Clerical personnel (1 Dispatch Coordinator and 4 Dispatcher/Clerks) and 7 sworn Reserve Officers.

- The Public Safety portion of the Town's Budget for Fiscal 2011/2012 is \$2,743,696; which includes the Fire Service contract with Boynton Beach of \$870,301.

- Attachment A shows the Table of Organization for the Police Department.

Scheduling:

- 2011 marked the first full year under the 12-hour work day schedule for those assigned to Patrol.

- As anticipated, this schedule provided for more efficient and effective shift coverage, and resulted in further reducing overtime costs.

- The resulting "Platoon System" has placed each Sergeant in a position of greater responsibility and accountability; both as individual supervisors and in terms of the overall activity of their team (one Sergeant and two Officers).

- One of the key benefits of the schedule's more stabilized 24/7 coverage was a decrease in overtime expenditures. In anticipation of that savings, the line item for Overtime/Vacation Pay was reduced by \$20,000 (from \$120,000 to \$100,000) during the Budget preparation process for Fiscal 2010/2011. The actual amount expended during the last fiscal year was \$67,479.18. It should be noted that this line item includes both overtime worked and accumulated vacation that is cashed in. Based on the realized savings last year, this line item was reduced another \$20,000 to \$80,000 for Fiscal 2011/2012; a 33% (\$40,000) reduction in this line item over the 2 years.

- Attachment B provides a comparison of the overtime expenditures for Fiscal 2009/2010 and 2010/2011. The result was a 27% decrease in cost.

Activity:

- Calls for Service:

- Attachment C shows a comparison of all Calls for Service for 2009 to 2010 and 2010 to 2011; along with the number of calls handled solely in Briny Breezes for 2011.

- As the statistics show, ORPD Officers handled 779 more calls for service last year than in 2010. The increase doesn't mean more crime. It includes the 255 calls handled in Briny Breezes in 2011; the first full year of the contract to provide law enforcement services to them. In addition, ORPD Officers have self-initiated more activity (especially for Code Violations).

- Also, citizens are reporting more suspicious persons/vehicles; something that is definitely encouraged. Attachment D is the flyer: "If You See Something, Say Something" to further provoke Ocean Ridge and Briny Breezes residents and visitors to do just that.

- Uniform Crime Reports:

- Annually, ORPD reports criminal activity to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) via the Florida Department of Law Enforcement. This information is used to create the "Uniform Crime Report"; statistics that all law enforcement agencies use to compare crime trends throughout the area, the state and the nation.

- Page 4 of Attachment C provides a comparison of the major crimes that were reported in 2009 – 2011. Last year, crime was down 6%. When combined with the 2010 reduction of 16%, major crime was down 22% over the 2-year period.

Briny Breezes:

- October 1, 2011 marked the start of the second year of a three contract with Briny Breezes for ORPD to provide law enforcement services.

- Prior to 2007, ORPD provided such services for nearly 30 years.

- As a result of the 3-year contract, Ocean Ridge receives \$185,000 per year. As Chief of ORPD, I serve as "Town Marshal" of Briny Breezes and all other Officers are sworn in as Deputy Town Marshals.

- We have quickly renewed our acquaintances with our neighbors to the south and have enjoyed a great working relationship.

Vehicles:

- Two replacement Police vehicles were purchased in 2011.

- One was authorized as a part of Budget process for Fiscal 2010/2011 and the second was purchased with surplus funds realized from the above-mentioned overtime savings. As a result, no vehicle purchase was funded for the current fiscal year.

- The lingering economic situation over the past 3 years has required a modification of the usual 2-vehicle per year replacement rotation program; reducing it to 1-vehicle per year. As Attachment E shows, this will result in a need to consider replacing 3-4 vehicles in Fiscal 2012/2013.

- Also included is the value realized from trading in the old cars. This netted \$7,400.00. This amount was slightly lower than previous years because of the added mileage that had accumulated on the vehicles that were replaced.

Collective Bargaining:

- In November 2010, the Sergeants and Officers of the Police Department voted to unionize and chose the Police Benevolent Association (PBA) to represent them.

- During the course of 2011, several meetings took place between representatives of the Town and the PBA. These negotiations resulted in the ratification of the first Collective Bargaining Agreement.

- It is worth noting that the police officers in the Towns of South Palm Beach and Manalapan also voted to unionize in 2010. Their negotiation efforts continue. The representatives of Ocean Ridge and the PBA should take pride in being able to work together toward this common goal.

"NG 9-1-1":

- During 2011, Palm Beach County 9-1-1 embarked on the installation of a state-of-the-art, county-wide system known as "Next Generation 9-1-1".

- Since the Ocean Ridge Police Department Dispatch Center is a designated "Public Safety Answering Point" (PSAP), new equipment was installed in December 2011. All Dispatchers attended training on this new equipment and the transition went very smoothly.

- In the future, the system will allow for calls to be received via text messaging and have the capability of receiving photographs & videos from citizens at the scene of emergencies.

- It is worthy to note that **all** full-time Ocean Ridge Police Department Dispatchers have met the training requirements and been awarded the new state-mandated Telecommunicator Certification. [Congratulations to everyone!](#)

E-Mail Alerts:

- The Police Department is utilizing the email list created by Town Hall for the monthly "Ocean Ridge Tidings" newsletter to provide timely alerts to residents regarding crime information or emergency situations (road closures, etc.).

- This is just the beginning of our intent to expand the use of Social Media to provide information to our residents. Please be sure to provide your email address to our Receptionist, Lisa Burns at: lburns@oceanridgeflorida.com.

Automated External Defibrillators:

- "AED's" have been proven to be effective life saving devices and all Police Department patrol vehicles are equipped with them.

- It was mentioned in last year's Annual Report, that the Police Department was seeking grant money to replace the old equipment. Two Ocean Ridge residents – Al Naar and Judy Kelley – came forward and donated the \$9,065 needed to fund the replacement. Within weeks of receiving their generosity, the Town was notified that Firehouse Subs, Inc. had approved our grant application for the same amount. Faced with this famine-to-feast windfall, Al and Judy provided authorization for their donation

to be applied toward the purchase of our Computer-Aided Dispatch/Records Management software.

Computer-Aided Dispatch/Records Management Software:

- The Police Department purchased its first CAD/RMS system; a process that had been in the works for over 5 years.

- In addition to the above mentioned nearly \$10,000 donation, a contribution from the Ocean Ridge Department of Public Safety Support Group, Inc. provided \$20,000 toward the acquisition of this much needed computer system. Their donation and continued support is greatly appreciated.

- The balance of the \$100,000 purchase was from surplus Capital Improvement funds.

- The new software was installed in October 2011, giving all Police Department employees two months for training and practice before "going live" on New Year's Day, January 1, 2012.

Computer Security:

- The Police Department has implemented equipment to address the FBI/FDLE mandate for upgraded computer security measures.

- This allows the members of the Police Department to have continued access to Federal and State Criminal Justice entities (NCIC/FCIC), the FL Department of Highway Safety & Motor Vehicles (Drivers License/Vehicle Registration), and many resources for investigative/intelligence purposes.

2012 and Beyond:

Accreditation:

- A complete review and overhaul of our Policy & Procedure Manual is underway.

- This lengthy but necessary process must be in place and operational for us to move forward toward Accreditation. To that end, Lt. Hutchins has been named the Police Department's "Accreditation Manager" and has attended courses to prepare us for this effort. Every member of the agency will take part in this process. Once updated policies and procedures are in place for approximately one year, we will then be in a better position to actually submit our application to the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation, Inc.

Grants/Partnerships:

- Success breeds success!

- The current economic conditions cause everyone to do more with less and to seek sources of revenue other than taxes.

- During 2011, the Police Department's efforts in seeking grants and building private partnerships resulted in funding most of the "Wish List" mentioned in last year's Annual Report. We shall continue to seek such funding so as to reduce the property tax burden placed on our residents.

Website upgrade:

- The explosion of Social Networking.

- An even greater opportunity to distribute information to the public regarding criminal activity, events, emergency information, etc. has emerged thru the use of Facebook, Twitter, and other such programs. Efforts to utilize such technology will continue to be explored.

Cameras:

- Automated License Plate Recognition (ALPR) equipment to provide enhanced security and investigative potential.

- In 2011 we partnered with the Manalapan Police Department and utilized their ALPR cameras to solve two cases. As a result, we have been researching the expansion of that system and/or the implementation of our own stand alone equipment to monitor traffic at both bridges and the south end of A1A.

On behalf of the entire Police Department, I want to express our appreciation for your continued support as we strive to provide a superior level of public service.




OCEAN RIDGE POLICE DEPARTMENT ORGANIZATIONAL CHART


