## Proclamation for National Police Week - May 11-17, 2014 and National Peace Officers' Memorial Day - May 15, 2014

WHEREAS, the Congress and President of the United States have designated May 15 as Peace Officers' Memorial Day, and the week in which May 15<sup>th</sup> falls as National Police Week; and

WHEREAS, the members of the Ocean Ridge Police Department play an essential role in safeguarding the rights and freedoms of the citizens in Ocean Ridge; and

WHEREAS, it is important that all citizens know and understand the duties, responsibilities, hazards, and sacrifices of their law enforcement agency, and that members of our law enforcement agency recognize their duty to serve the people by safeguarding life and property, by protecting them against violence and disorder, and by protecting the innocent against deception and the weak against oppression; and

WHEREAS, the men and women of the Ocean Ridge Police Department unceasingly provide a vital public service;

NOW, therefore, I, Geoffrey A. Pugh, Mayor of the Town Of Ocean Ridge, call upon all citizens and all patriotic, civic and educational organizations to observe the week of May 11-17, 2014 as National Police Week with appropriate ceremonies and observances in which all of our people may join in commemorating law enforcement officers, past and present, who, by their faithful and loyal devotion to their responsibilities, have rendered a dedicated service to their communities and, in so doing, have established for themselves an enviable and enduring reputation for preserving the rights and security of all citizens.
